Talking to patients about the **COVID-19** vaccine

Dental teams play an important role in providing care during the COVID-19 pandemic. They also have a role in bringing this public health emergency to an end.

The patients we serve often experience health disparities that have been magnified by this pandemic.

We now have a powerful tool that can prevent COVID-19 and help end this pandemic: the COVID-19 vaccine. Dental teams have a unique opportunity to help increase the number of patients who are vaccinated in multiple ways:

- Research shows that the majority of people trust their health care providers to provide reliable information about COVID-19 vaccines.
- > Patient conversations with clinicians result in higher vaccination rates.
- Some patients visit their dental providers more often than their medical providers. Dental visits provide a touchpoint during which patients and their providers can have conversations about the vaccine.
- Conversations over multiple visits are often necessary to increase vaccine acceptance.
